YARD WASTE

Yard Waste to begin Monday April 1st! Please note that bags will be weighed if your bag **does not** meet the requirements

it will not be picked up. Be sure that the bags are out at the curb in view.

- Each bag or bundle must be tagged
- Kraft bags ONLY! No cans or plastic containers
- Brush must be bundled in four (4) foot lengths

• MAX weight is thirty (30) pounds

RECYCLING AND GARBAGE

Please have your Garbage and Recycling ready for pick up on Wednesday's by 6:00 AM. Unless one of the following holidays falls on or before your service day - **New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiv-ing Day and Christmas Day** - then trash will be a day late. If you miss your service day you will have to wait.

Any trash sitting outside the can will NOT be taken. This includes cardboard boxes, they are not trash cans, put your extra garbage in a plastic bag if need be and please tie the bag. Thank you.

- PLEASE do NOT use the 30 / 40 / 50 gallon plastic barrels they will NOT be emptied. You can have bags or cans 4-32 gallon cans or bags a week, not exceeding 30# pounds. Toters are not dumpsters - please do not treat them like they are. No piles at all, large or small.
- NO construction debris will be picked up, NO burn pile, NO hot tubs, NO large sectional couches and NO hid-abeds.
- Carpet must be in 4x4 squares or 4 ft. rolls, tied, taped or bundled somehow for easy pick up. Sorry for the inconvenience.
- You are allowed one large item on the last service day of each month at NO CHARGE! Large items can be bedding or 1 piece of furniture, a table or 4 chairs. NO appliances, NO tires, NO e-waste, if it plugs into the wall it is electronic waste.
- PAINT- take off the lid, let it sit and dry out or add sand/cat litter/floor dry, then we can take it. If it is still liquid form we cannot.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED: dirt, rock, brick, sand, concrete, burn pile or any kind of livestock manure. We do NOT take construction debris with regular household garbage, Call for a dumpster.

Hazardous waste can NOT be accepted under any circumstance.



Preparing Your Recyclables

In general, recyclables do not have to be sorted. Sorting is done at the landfill. **PLEASE DO NOT** put your recyclables in a plastic bag or on the ground in another box.

- Newspaper Including the inserts, magazines, hardback and paperback books, telephone books, office paper and 3rd class or junk mail including plastic window envelopes.
- Plastics #1 #7 except Styrofoam (PS) #6 -. Acceptable plastics are designated by a number inside the recycling triangle. Rinse containers and throw the lids away. Crush plastic containers the best you can to reduce their volume in your bin.
- Glass Bottles and Jars Only clear, brown or green glass that contained a food or beverage can be recycled. You may leave the labels on glass containers, but rinse them thoroughly and throw away the lids. No Pyrex, ceramic or drinking glasses. Also for the safety of the collection crews and sorters, broken glass will not be accepted.

Tin and Aluminum Cans - To recycle aluminum and steel cans, clean them thoroughly. Aluminum foil and pie pans are also acceptable. Make sure all are clean and free of food before you put them in your bin.

Cardboard - including cereal and Kleenex boxes. Corrugated cardboard must be flattened and bundled in 2' X 2' bundles.

NOT ACCEPTED: Batteries of any kind, Children's plastic toys, Garden hose, Diapers, Food Waste, Small propane tanks, CD's, Christmas lights and electrical cords, Paper plates, toilet tissue, paper towels, Kleenex tissues, wax cartons, Keurig coffee filters, wrapping paper and bows, Styrofoam and plastic bags. Items with food residue, Grass and wood is not recyclable, neither is vinyl siding, or furnace filters, cigarette butts. Metal building supplies or metal scrap, broken glass. Motor oil, antifreeze, oil filter or paint contact hazardous waste facility.
