FROM THE NEW CODE OF ORDINANCE BOOK.



36.04.060 Snow Removal

Policy. It is the policy of the village that snow removal from the public ways of the village shall not be required where there is less than two inches of snowfall.

Parking restrictions. There shall be no parking upon any public way on any day when there has been snow accumulated to a depth of two inches or more. This prohibition shall be in effect until the village maintenance crews have cleared the public way and the snowfall has ceased for that day. The presence of operating village snow removal equipment on the public ways of the village shall be conclusive evidence of two inches of snowfall. Vehicles in violation of this section will be ticketed by the assigned village department and towed away.

Depositing snow on public ways prohibited. No person shall clean private drives or sidewalks in such a manner that shall result in the deposit of snow into the public ways due to the snow removal from such private drives or sidewalks. Further, with the exception of village employees, in the course of their employment duties, no person shall shovel, push, plow or place, in any way, gravel or debris onto another property or right-of-way.
