President Christopher Bornhoeft called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM. Clerk Bergeson called the roll noting a quorum was present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Meeting was held at the Village Hall.

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF AN ILLINOIS TRANSPORTATION
ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM (ITEP) GRANT APPLICATION FOR BICYCLE AND
PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS IN THE VILLAGE OF HAMPTON, COUNTY OF
ROCK ISLAND, STATE OF ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the Village of Hampton, located in the County of Rock Island, State of Illinois, desires to participate in the construction of bicycle and pedestrian facilities with crosswalk improvements on the Great River Road Bike Path, (the "Project"), to complete the network in this area and enhance non-motorized transportation along the corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Hampton has participated in the ITEP Plan, and has determined that the Project is consistent with the strategic priorities identified in the plan; and

WHEREAS, an Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) Grant will fund 80% of eligible preliminary engineering, design, construction, and construction engineering and 50% of right-of-way and street lighting of the proposed improvements with the remaining costs and ineligibles to be paid for with local funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Village of Hampton, Rock Island County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into, and made part of, this Resolution.

SECTION 2: The Village of Hampton does hereby commit to paying up to 20% required local match to complete the design, construction, and construction engineering and up to 50% required local match for right-of-way acquisition and street lighting, and all ineligible costs associated with the Project.

SECTION 3: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2026-06

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 42, ENTITLED "TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES," OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, VILLAGE OF HAMPTON, ILLINOIS, IN ORDER TO REGULATE THE USE OF LOW-SPEED ELECTRIC BICYCLES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF HAMPTON

WHEREAS, the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-2-1, provides that the corporate authorities of each municipality may pass all ordinances and make all rules and regulations proper or necessary, to carry into effect the powers granted to municipalities, with such fines or penalties as may be deemed proper; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Hampton is a non-home rule Illinois municipality pursuant to the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-80-2 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-80-2) grants to the corporate authorities of each municipality the power to regulate the use of streets or other municipal property; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-1517 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/11-1517) regulates the operation of low-speed electric bicycles; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities of the Village of Hampton have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village to regulate the operation of low-speed electric bicycles within the corporate limits of the Village, consistent with Section 11-1517 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the President and Village Board of the Village of Hampton, Rock Island County, State of Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated herein as the findings of the corporate authorities.

Section 2: Article 42.16, entitled "16 SKATING DEVICES, SCOOTERS, AND MOTORIZED CARTS", of "Chapter 42" entitled "TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES", of the Code of Ordinances, Village of Hampton, Illinois, shall be and is hereby amended to change title to: SKATING DEVICES, SCOOTERS, ELECTRIC BICYCLES/CARTS AND MOTORIZED CARTS. and

Section 3: Article 42.16, entitled "16 SKATING DEVICES, SCOOTERS, AND MOTORIZED CARTS", of "Chapter 42" entitled "TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES", of the Code of Ordinances, Village of Hampton, Illinois, shall be and is hereby amended to include:

"DIVISION III" entitled "E-SCOOTERS, E-BICYCLES, MICROMOBILITY VEHICLES"

Sec. 42.16.30 -- Low-Speed Electric Bicycles

(a) Definitions.

(1) *Low-Speed Electric Bicycle.* A low-speed electric bicycle means a bicycle equipped with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than 750 watts (that is not a moped, e-moto, motor-driven cycle, minibike or pocket bike) that meets the requirements of one of the following classes:

- i. *Class 1 low-speed electric bicycle* means a low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that aids only when the rider is pedaling and that ceases to aid when the bicycle reaches a speed of 20 miles per hour.
- ii. *Class 2 low-speed electric bicycle* means a low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that may be used exclusively to propel the bicycle and that cannot aid when the bicycle reaches a speed of 20 miles per hour.
- iii. *Class 3 low-speed electric bicycle* means a low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that aids only when the rider is pedaling, and that ceases to aid when the bicycle reaches a speed of 28 miles per hour.

(2) *Low-speed e-scooters* are devices weighing less than 100 pounds, with 2 or 3

wheels, handlebars, and a floorboard that can be stood upon while riding, that are solely powered by an electric motor and human power, and whose maximum speed, with or without human propulsion, is no more than 10 miles per hour.

(3) *Micromobility devices* include a broad range of lightweight, low-speed travel modes that serve as personal mobility and have a top assisted speed of 20 mph.

(4) *E-motos (Out of Class Electric Vehicles)* are devices with an electric motor greater than 750 watts and are not e-bikes. Any type of device with an electric motor device with a Class 1, 2, or 3 electric bicycle is not a legal e-bike and should not be advertised, sold, offered for sale, or labeled as an e-bike. E-motos typically:

- i. Are an electric device built on a bicycle-style frame that is equipped with one or more operating modes and a throttle
- ii. Are capable of exceeding 20 miles per hour on motorized propulsion alone in any mode when the throttle is engaged
- iii. Have an electric motor with a power output exceeding 750 watts

(5) *Incorporation of Terms Defined in Illinois Vehicle Code.* Unless otherwise defined in this code, terms in this section shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Illinois Vehicle Code.

(b) *Designated Areas of Operation of Low-Speed Electric Bicycles.*

- (1) A person may operate a low-speed electric bicycle upon any highway, street, or roadway in the village authorized for use by bicycles, including, but not limited to, bicycle lanes, unless noted in this section.
- (2) A person may operate a low-speed electric bicycle upon any bicycle path in the City.
- (3) No person shall operate a low-speed electric bicycle on a sidewalk in the City.

(c) *Rules and Regulations Applicable to Low-Speed Electric Bicycles.*

(1) Rules of general applicability:

- i. No person shall knowingly tamper or modify the speed capability or engagement of a low-speed electric bicycle without complying with the requirements of 625 ILCS 5/11-1517.
- ii. No person shall operate a low-speed electric bicycle with a conscious disregard for the safety of others and/or the operator, which poses a substantial and unjustifiable risk to the safety of the operator or others. Reckless operation does not have to result in injury.
- iii. Every person operating a low-speed electric bicycle upon a roadway shall obey all traffic rules applicable to vehicles.

(2) Rules specifically applicable to *Class 1* electric bicycles:

- i. A Class 1 low-speed electric bicycle shall operate in a manner so that the electric motor is disengaged or ceases to function when the rider stops pedaling.

(3) Rules specifically applicable to *Class 2* low-speed electric bicycles:

- i. A Class 2 low-speed electric bicycle shall operate in a manner so that the electric motor is disengaged or ceases to function when the brakes are applied.

(4) Rules specifically applicable to *Class 3* low-speed electric bicycles:

- i. No person may operate a Class 3 low-speed electric bicycle if he or she is less than 16 years of age. A person who is less than 16 years of age may ride as a passenger on a Class 3 low-speed electric bicycle that is designed to accommodate passengers.
- ii. A Class 3 low-speed electric bicycle shall operate in a manner so that the electric motor is disengaged or ceases to function when the rider stops pedaling.
- iii. Each Class 3 low-speed electric bicycle shall be equipped with a

speedometer that displays the speed the bicycle is traveling in miles per hour.

(5) Rules specifically applicable to ***Low Speed E-Scooters***:

(7) Rules specifically applicable to ***E-motos***:

- i. Restricted. No person shall operate a motor driven cycle (as defined in Section 1- 145.001 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/1- 145.001)), e-moto, minibike or pocket bike upon any public street, sidewalk, parking lot, bike path, park or on any other public property in the Village of Hampton. An e-moto means a motor driven cycle that has an electric motor with a power output exceeding 750 watts and is equipped with a dedicated throttle and without operable pedals.

(d) *Violations – Penalty*. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this section shall be subject to a fine prescribed in Article 4.08 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Hampton, Rock Island County, Illinois. ~~Contracted Code~~ Enforcement shall have the authority to impound the low-speed electric bicycle, subject to the code hearing unit adjudication provisions of Article 4.08 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Hampton, Rock Island County, Illinois. An offense committed by a minor under the direct control or with the consent of a parent or guardian may subject the parent or guardian to the penalties provided in this section.

Section 4: Article 42.16, entitled "16 SKATING DEVICES, SCOOTERS, AND MOTORIZED CARTS", of "Chapter 42" entitled "TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES", of the Code of Ordinances, Village of Hampton, Illinois, shall be and is hereby amended to include:

"DIVISION IV" entitled "MOTOR-DRIVEN CYCLES, MINIBIKES, AND POCKET BIKES"

Sec. 42.16.40 – Operation of motor-driven cycles, minibikes and pocket bikes

a. Definitions

- i. *Motor-driven Cycles* are typically motorcycles with 150cc or less motor output on a two-wheel chassis. The combustion engine may produce speeds up to 30 miles per hour or more.
- ii. *Micromobility devices (combustion engines)* include a broad range of lightweight, low-speed travel modes that serve as personal mobility and have combustion engines assist.
- iii. *Minibikes* are typically smaller and designed for off-road use. They are combustion assisted and often have lower engine displacement compared to standard motorcycles.
- iv. *Pocket Bike* is a small, motorized vehicle designed for one rider. It typically has a seat height of less than 38 inches from the ground. The engine displacement is usually 50cc or less. Pocket bikes are not street-legal and cannot be operated on public roads.

b. Restricted. No person shall operate a motor-driven cycle (as defined in Section 1-

- i. 145.001 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/1-145.001)), e-moto, minibike or pocket bike upon any public street, sidewalk, parking lot, bike path, park or on any other public property in the Village of Hampton.

c. Violations – Penalty. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this section shall be subject to a fine prescribed in Article 4.08 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Hampton, Rock Island County, Illinois. Contracted Code Enforcement shall have the authority to impound the ~~motor-driven cycle, minibike and pocket bike low-speed electric bicycle~~, subject to the code hearing unit adjudication provisions of Article 4.08 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Hampton, Rock Island County, Illinois. An offense committed by a minor under the direct control or with the consent of a parent or guardian may subject the parent or guardian to the penalties provided in this section.

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Section 5: All ordinances, resolutions and policies or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of the conflict, expressly repealed on the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 6: If any provision of this Ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstances is ruled unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid application or provision, and each invalid provision or invalid application of this Ordinance is severable.

Section 7: The headings/captions identifying the various sections and subsections of this Ordinance are for reference only and do not define, modify, expand or limit any of the terms or provisions of the Ordinance.

Section 8: The clerk is directed by the corporate authorities to publish this Ordinance. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect 10 days after its passage and publication in accordance with Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-2-4).
