

## VILLAGE OF HAMPTON FIRE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION

- No person shall cause the open burning of refuse or garbage, or conduct any salvage operation by open burning.
- No person shall, in the drug free zone around Hampton Elementary School, cause open burning while students are in session.
- Any person conducting open burning shall ensure that adequate provisions are available to prevent the fire from spreading or burning out of control. Adequate provisions include but are not limited to; garden hose, bucket(s) of water or properly rated fire extinguisher of adequate size to extinguish a fire.
- No person shall allow or cause to allow any open fire to be unattended until such fire has extinguished itself or is extinguished by other means. Extinguishment shall mean that all embers are cool and no longer producing heat or flames and there shall be no smoke or smoldering remnants.
- This Section shall not limit the open burning of leaves, grass clippings, shrubs, bushes, branches or any other landscape waste upon the premises where it is produced, the burning of landscape waste for agricultural purposes, habitat management (included but not limited to forest and prairie reclamation) or firefighter training. This Section shall not limit the open burning of cooking fires, either charcoal or wood, campfires or other like open fires determined to be recreational in nature.
- Burning of authorized material as defined in Section 4.14.2 will be allowed Tuesday through Saturday during the daytime hours defined as sunrise to sunset or 8:00 PM, whichever is later. All fires must be fully extinguished so no smoldering material or embers are present after sunset or 8:00 PM, whichever is later. Burning days and times in this section do not apply to fires determined as recreational in nature.
