UPDATED LEAF BURNING ORDINANCE

Leaf and yard waste burning is allowed Wednesday through Saturday* from sunrise to sunset or 8:00 p.m., whichever is later. *Burning is not allowed on the last Saturday of the month. Burning is prohibited Sunday through Tuesday every week. All fires must be fully extinguished (no smoldering, smoking or hot embers) by sunset or 8:00 p.m. Burning of non-lawn waste materials of any kind is prohibited, including, but not limited to: garbage, cardboard, construction materials, furniture, tires, etc. A water source must be available at the fire location, the mire must be monitored inperson and be controlled at all times. No embers should travel to any adjacent property. Burning is prohibited on all red-flag and crop fire danger days as determined by the National Weather Service.

NEW STOP SIGNS ADDED AROUND HAMPTON SCHOOL

Please be aware that there are now stops signs on 2nd and 3rd Avenues at the intersections of 4th, 5th and 6th Streets. Please be sure you obey the stop signs to ensure the safety for the children and visitors to Hampton School.

UPDATED PARKING ORDINANCE

The parking ordinance has been updated to prohibit parking as follows:

- At any place where the standing of a vehicle will reduce the usable width of the roadway to moving traffic to less than 18 feet
- At any place where the vehicle would block the use of a driveway
- Within 15 feet of any mailbox
- In any alley
- On the boulevards unless they have been improved for parking

- In fire lanes
- In any intersection
- Within 20 feet of any intersection
- In any crosswalk
- On any sidewalk to include parking in a manner that blocks the sidewalk
- Within 15 feet of any fire hydrant
- Facing the wrong way on any street/avenue
- Within 10 feet of or in front of any fire hydrant
